Instructions:

Print the pages on heavy-weight cardstock. Trim off .39" margin on each side of page, then cut as follows:

- Days of the week: 4.1" x 3.86"
- Numbers: 3.4" x 6.8"
- Months: 4.1" x 3.86"


You can punch holes in each piece and pin it to a bulletin board, attach magnets to the back of each sheet and post them on a magnet board, or pin them directly to your wall. Then, each day, you just pick the pieces that match with the day and date.

A perpetual calendar never expires, so you can use it from year to year. Enjoy!


